

Biography for Gina Price Lundberg, MD FACC FAHA

Gina Price Lundberg MD FACC FAHA is an Associate Professor of Medicine at Emory University and Clinical Director of the Emory Women's Heart Center. She is a Preventive Cardiologist and has practiced at Emory Saint Joseph's Hospital of Atlanta since 1998. She was invited to join the Emory University faculty in 2012 and led the development of the Emory Women's Heart program with three locations across the metro Atlanta area. She made the shift to academia in order to fulfill her scholarly desire and joined Emory University School of Medicine faculty. She loves teaching medical trainees of all levels and is currently instructing outpatient clinical cardiology for medical students, nurse practitioner students, nurse midwife students and physician assistant students at Emory University. She mentors high school and college students, especially women, to consider careers in medicine, math, science, and technology. She supports the Emory Women in Cardiology female fellows through a monthly gathering to mentor, coach and support women residents and fellows. She works with many of these young women on academic research, publications and leadership development.

She has been interviewed on the subject of Heart Disease in Women on CNN, NPR and frequently in USA Today. She is a National American Heart Association (AHA) Spokesperson. Governor Sonny Perdue appointed Dr. Lundberg to the Advisory Board for the Department of Women's Health for the State of Georgia in 2007 till 2011. She is a Castle Connelly Atlanta Magazine "Top Doc" for Atlanta 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019. In 2005, Atlanta Woman Magazine awarded Dr. Lundberg the Top 10 Innovator Award for Medicine. In 2008 Atlanta Woman Magazine named her one of the Top 25 Professional Women to Watch and the only woman in the field of medicine. She received the Castle Connelly Exceptional Women in Medicine Award in 2017 and 2019.

Dr. Lundberg has been a Board Member of the American Heart Association for Atlanta from 2001 till 2007 and was on the Southeast Affiliate Board 2006-2007. She also served on the Southeast Affiliate Strategic Health Initiatives Committee to promote Go Red for Women. She has been involved in the Go Red for Women initiative for the metro Atlanta area since its development in 2003. Dr. Lundberg was the Honoree for North Fulton/ Gwinnett County Heart Ball for 2006. In 2009 she was awarded the Women with Heart Award at the Go Red Luncheon for outstanding dedication to the program. She is a Circle of Red founding member and Cor Vitae member for AHA. She served on the American College of Cardiology Foundation (ACCF) Prevention of Cardiovascular Disease Committee from 2006 till 2012. She was awarded Fellow of the AHA (FAHA) by the Clinical Cardiology Section in 2019.

Since 1995, Dr Lundberg has been an active Fellow of the American College of Cardiology (ACC). She served on the ACC Committee for Prevention of Cardiovascular Disease for two terms and is currently on the ACC Disparities of Care Working Group. She is on the ACC Georgia Chapter Council and has given clinical lectures at the state annual scientific meetings several times. Currently, she serves on the national ACC Women in Cardiology (WIC) Council and serves on the Communications and Social Media Committee. She has been active in the ACC Georgia Chapter since 1998, serving on the state chapter council since 2014, and active in the Georgia WIC section since it was founded. She is the Diversity and Inclusion chair for the state chapter. She is dedicated to working hard for the ACC to improve health care for patients and for the profession through research and education.

She is passionate about improving gender equity in cardiology and is on the Emory Department of Medicine Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion committee. She was asked to Co-Chair the Emory School of Medicine Task Force to End Sexual Harassment in Academic Medicine in 2019 which led to an Emory School of Medicine statement and support of the Time's Up Healthcare signatory. She is on the Emory Alliance of Women in Medicine and Science Committee since 2019 as well.

Dr. Lundberg has two adult children. Dr. Lundberg has lived most of her life in the metro Atlanta area. She enjoys spending time in the north Georgia mountains, snow skiing, travel and reading. She is passionate about better health through Social Media. She also enjoys serving on short term medical mission trips with her church.
